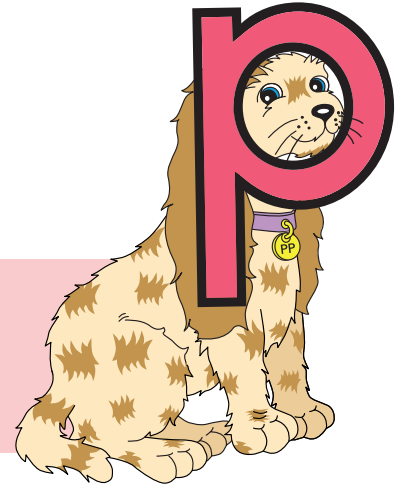


You will need:

- Cardboard
- Large circle template (e.g. a glass)
- Small circle template
- Wool
- Scissors
- Pen

Did you know?

The term 'pom pom' comes from the French word 'pompon', meaning "a small decorative ball made of fabric or feathers".

**Instructions**

1. Draw two circles onto the cardboard using your large circle template. Draw a smaller circle within each of them.
2. Ask an adult to help you cut out the cardboard to create a donut shape. Then cut out a small chunk from each donut. Make sure both pieces of cardboard are the same.
3. Hold the two pieces of cardboard together. Wrap the wool tightly around them (the more wool you use, the fluffier your pom pom will be) and cut the end of the wool.
4. Ask an adult to help you separate the two pieces of cardboard and cut in between them, cutting the wool.
5. Take a long piece of wool and thread it in between the pieces of cardboard. Pull tightly and knot.



6. Remove the cardboard to create your pom pom!
Repeat this with lots of different colours. We used the colours in the Letterland logo!



7. Once you've got enough pom poms (we made 10), cut a long piece of wool. This will attach all your pom poms together.



8. Simply tie the wool tightly around your first pom pom and knot it to start the garland. Repeat, making sure the pom poms are an equal distance from each other.



9. Hang up at home or in your classroom to show off your hard work!
